

WELCOME 2008! NORTH ISLAND MAIN TRUNK CENTENNIAL YEAR!

It now seems likely there will be at least FIVE separate functions to mark the Centennial of the North Island Main Trunk line, or important sections of this vital rail artery between Auckland & Wellington. A number of FRONZ member organisations, together with key stake-holders, railfans and the public are in for a treat.

Though it might seem to the uninitiated that the announcement of what is taking place has been slow, those involved know only too well how important it is to get it right first time. Some details are still sketchy but will build upon the following:

A: PARLIAMENTARY SPECIAL: Over the three day period from August 6th to 8th, OnTrack and the Crown will sponsor a re-run of the Parliamentary Special that ran in August 1908 to take Parliamentarians to Auckland for the visit of the Great White Fleet. The train will run over three days from Wellington to Palmerston North on 6 August; to Taumarunui on 7 August and finally to arrive in Auckland on 8 August.

Seats are likely to be allocated for MP's VIP's Dignitaries and Celebrities. The train will be hauled by a variety of steam locos supplied by FRONZ members and include former PWD "L" locos 507 & 509 from MoTaT and Silver Stream Railway for a portion of this historic re-run, representing the locos used on the original train.

- B: RAILFAN CELEBRATIONS: Based at Feilding over Labour Weekend a variety of excursions, short and long will take participants from Woodville to Wanganui and Taumarunui, Watch the website www.allaboard.org.nz for developing details. Sponsored by the Feilding & District Steam Rail Society and Feilding Promotions, the programme will include locos and rolling stock from a number of FRONZ members and a Cavalcade of Locomotives will be staged at Feilding on Sunday 26 October
- at Feilding on Sunday 26 October.

 C: LAST SPIKE CEREMONY RE-ENACTMENT: Together with the communities of Ohakune, Raetihi & Taumarunui, this event will take place at the Obelisk site on 6th November, OnTrack, Ruapehu District Council and others are combining to organise this event which will be aimed at VIPs and community leaders, though there should be some room for the public. The train is likely to comprise Toll rolling stock and may not include steam.

 D: WMR HAND-OVER & PAEKAKARIKI: Yet to be announced is a celebration based around Paekakariki to remember the hand-over to the Government of the privately-owned Wellington & Manawatu Railway. Likely dates November 2008
- E: TOLL RAIL & TRANZ SCENIC: We understand the company wishes to celebrate the Centennial of the commencement of regular passenger trains between Wellington and Auckland due in February 2009.



CLIMAX 1317 TRUST INCORPORATED

The FRONZ Calendar Year 2008 is off to a great start with the addition of a new member organisation, bringing our total membership to 68.

The Climax 1317 Trust Inc., was formed jointly by the Te Awamutu Lions Club and Waipa District Council to restore for static display # 1317 which had for many years stood deteriorating on a plinth in a park. The rebuild is well underway.

Climax 1317 was one of several steam engines used by Smyth Bros and Boyer Ltd to haul logs along bush tramways for timber mills in the central North Island of New Zealand, at Arohena till 1946 and then in Ngaroma till 1954. It was driven by Archie McMillan. The firm had bought Climax 1317 from Carter Timber who had taken over the Egmont Box Company.



CLIMAX 1317 ON SMYTH BROS & BORYER TRAMWAY: Unattributed photo.


It was gifted to the town of Te Awamutu in the late 1950's by Smyth Bros and Boyer Ltd. 1317 was moved from the Memorial Park to a Council depot in Daphne Street on the 4th December 2004. It had been an Icon of Te Awamutu's Memorial Park for aprox' 44 years. The class B Climax was built in 1915 and is one of only six imported from Corry, Pennsylvania. This and three others survive, the others being one each at Tokomaru Steam Museum, the Bush Tramway Club and at ShantyTown.

Joe Tolich, present at the time 1317 was moved out of the Park, was the only surviving member of the party which brought 1317 into Te Awamutu in 1960. The project was undertaken by the Jaycees. A truck was borrowed from Reg Schimanski and driven by George Bain. Mr Tolich recalled the engine was on a raised siding at Ngaroma. Mr Bain backed the truck into the siding and forestry workers pushed the engine onto the truck with another engine. Everyone was surprised at how easily the shift went. Driving into town on the narrow road proved more dangerous, especially when Mr Bain pulled over for a car and the weight of the engine pulled the truck down the camber and off the road. The truck stopped, but was stuck. The team recruited a nearby farmer to pull them out with his tractor. They stuck to the middle of the road after that. The engine was taken through land that is now Christie Avenue and was tipped onto rails on a prior built concrete pad. In 2004, Mr Tolich said amazingly, it slid neatly onto the resting place it had for the last 44 years without a hitch

The move out of the Memorial Park required the track along the Mangaohoi stream to be widened and gravel laid and an access was cut through to Christie Ave'. With the engine supported by a crane, the engine's wheel assembly was pulled out using a digger. Then the engine was lifted and loaded onto wood blocks on a flatbed truck. It travelled to the Council depot in Daphne Street. and was then lowered onto wood blocks. Rails under the blocks were rolled over steel pipes in order to move the engine into the depot shed with a push from a loader driven by Jeff Bowers

Considerable progress has been made in rebuilding the loco since 2004. All offers of assistance are welcome and the best person to contact if you can lend a hand is Russell Easton on (07) 871 5576.


CLIMAX 1317 settles into Memorial Park Te Awamutu in 1960.



TRANSPORT OF DANGEROUS GOODS NZS 5433:2007

New Standard for the transport of dangerous goods
Standards New Zealand has just published the latest
revision of NZS 5433:2007 Transport of
Dangerous Goods on Land. The Standard has been
revised to reflect the latest changes in United
Nations information and the Land Transport Rule
and will enable you to comply with mandatory
transport regulations and best industry practice.

The Land Transport Rule is mandatory for all operators and was updated in 2005. The 1999 Standard should no longer be used.

The revised Standard is presented in two durable ring binders and covers all aspects of transporting dangerous goods, including packaging, segregation, documentation, auditing, and signage. Part 1 contains the Standard and Part 2 contains the UN tables. The two parts are interdependent and are designed to be used together. A laminated Segregation Wheel is included with each hard copy of the two part Standard.
