UTILITIES ACCESS ACT 2010

This Act controls the interaction between Utility Operators and transport corridors

Last year FRONZ made submissions to the Bill stating that we found the provisions in the draft onerous on our members and (in some clauses) unworkable. It was obvious that the Bill's drafters assumed that there was only one railway in NZ. The Select Committee agreed with much of our submission and proposed numerous changes.

The amended Act became law in August this year and bears no resemblance to the original. It takes 18 clauses to say that there will be a Code of Practice (and that everyone has to comply). It also states that the preparers of the CoP must consult with all operators likely to be affected.

The NZ Utilities Advisory Group is writing the CoP. Once again, they assumed that there is only one railway in NZ until KiwiRail told them otherwise. (KiwiRail also told them that the railway section that KR is involved in writing **does not** apply to other railways.)

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The Advisory Group were horrified to find out from NZTA that there are 90 rail operators in NZ and their first thought was to exempt all other railways but were told by the government that they can't.

The Group's Executive Officer then contacted FRONZ and we have agreed that, once they reach agreement with Ki-wiRail they will come back to us to draft a joint policy for FRONZ members. Hopefully we can come to an agreement that satisfies all our members. (Just how they will consult with the 40+ private siding operators is anybodies guess.)
